

Birds and Birding Solutions in Northeast Spain and Beyond

After collaborating on a successful Catalonia Bird Tour this spring **Ornitholidays** have launched several new tours for 2012 in cooperation with **Birding In Spain**. These are **Southern Catalonia**, **Extremadura and Doñana**, and the **Western Pyrenees**.

The Extremadura and Doñana tour follows a well-known formula guaranteed to encounter a great number and variety of exciting birds in some of the most harmonious landscapes of Western Europe. Extremadura is the home of plains species such as Great and Little Bustards, Great Spotted Cuckoo, Montagu's Harrier, Pin-tailed and Black-bellied Sandgrouse. Here too is the unique Monfrague National Park with 5 species of eagle possible in one morning! Spanish Imperial Eagle, Black Stork, Eagle Owl, Black Vulture, Azure-winged Magpie and Black-winged Kites are among the great birds awaiting participants on this tour.

Coto Doñana rarely needs much presentation, its fame as the best wetland reserve in the Western Mediterranean precedes it. Here we can see Spoonbill, Greater Flamingo, Purple Gallinule, Collared Pratincole, Little Bittern, Squacco Heron and a

whole lot more.

Southern Catalonia is scheduled to take place in June and has quite a different approach: walking, discovering nature and absorbing a little culture (and some wine too!). That's why it features as one of Ornitholidays Quest for Nature Tours, a filial company that seeks to take in as much nature as presents itself! Which of course doesn't mean that we will be ignoring the birds: we expect to encounter all the typical Mediterranean specialities plus the wetland birds of the Ebro delta. But also butterflies, flowers, amphibians, secluded spots for a cooling dip in mountain rivers...Nobody else offers a trip quite like this one.



The Western Pyrenees Most travelled birders know that the Spanish Pyrenees are home to specialities such as Wallcreeper, Lammergeier, Alpine Accentor, Citril Finch and Black Woodpecker. And some of the most magnificent scenery too. But what about the birds of the Ebro Valley and inland wetlands of Navarra, which just happen to be enroute to our destination in the Pyrenees? This variation should add Great Bittern, Bearded Tit, Red-crested Pochard, Black-bellied Sandgrouse and even the chance of encountering a Middle Spotted Woodpecker on day 1!

Bonelli's Eagles nest successfully!



Birders and photographers who have stayed at Montsonís know that they can enjoy great views of Bonelli's Eagles just outside the village itself. What they surely don't know is that the resident pair of Bonelli's Eagles here had not bred successfully since 2005.




This was mainly due to disturbance from celebrations near the nest and perhaps food shortage in the breeding season.

We decided that after having taken so much from the eagles that we had to try and give something back, and that in part we were morally responsible to do something to try and reverse this worrying trend. We established a supplementary feeding programme using feral pigeons trapped from buildings where they were a nuisance. We also wrote and delivered a letter to local entities and leisure or tourism agents asking them for their help in controlling and impeding noisy celebrations and disturbance in the vicinity of the eagles' nest. The Bonelli's Eagles responded generously by successfully raising a healthy chick. The first one to leave that particular nest since 2005!

Catalonia bird tour news



Judging by the feedback the first Ornitholidays Catalonia tour was a great success. It's rather difficult to pinpoint the highlights of this bird-packed tour, but we'll try! Some of the participants chose Citril Finch as their favourites, others went for the Lammergeiers, although the majority vote was for the Eagle Owls with their chicks. Redthroated Pipit, Pied Crow, Lesser Kestrel, Pin-tailed Sandgrouse, and Collared Pratincole also raised a few smiles of appreciation.

Without Steve's knowledge of where to find the birds and his identification skills - both visual and aural - we would have missed many of the key species.

We had not expected to be looking at a pair of Eagle Owls ten minutes after Steve picked us up on day one! Having started on such a high note, things could easily have gone steadily

downhill thereafter. Happily they didn't. Among the other highlights during the first two days around Lleida were the seven species of lark (particularly the surprisingly close views of

Dupont's), the groups of Pin-tailed and Black-bellied Sandgrouse, the many different species of warbler, the frequent sightings of Stone Curlew, the Great Spotted Cuckoo and, of course, the prolonged close-up views of Golden Eagle.

In the Pyrenees it was great to see Lammergeier and the other vultures and raptors. We also enjoyed the very close views of Alpine Accentor, Citril Finch, Alpine Chough, Ring Ouzel, Firecrest - and many more.



Our tour far exceeded our expectations and we are already looking forward to seeing Steve next February for some winter birding!'

Bird news from Catalonia

The last of the 3 **Black-winged Kites** that spent much of the winter on the drylands of Alfés to the south of Lleida was last seen in the area in early March.





The **Eagle Owl** pair to the south of Lleida that Garry and Wendy Philpott referred to raised 3 chicks, which were thoroughly enjoyed by our guests in April. On a later visit in May the birds could not be found, and are likely to have dispersed to adjacent areas.

2 Eleonora's Falcons were observed on passage through the Lleida drylands in late June, and spent some time pursuing the local nesting Hobbies. Luckily they didn't catch them! Eleonora's Falcons are often seen in early summer in ones or twos on the drylands of Lleida. One bird was reported by Alan Bale at Montclar on 21st July catching a bat!

The first **Red-footed Falcons** of the spring were reported from Balaguer on the 11th May. The count rose from 3 on the 11th to a maximum of 15 in the same area two days later. The last individuals were seen around Balaguer on 28th May, while the latest spring record in general was of a second calendar year male (photo) which stayed on the Bellmunt drylands until mid-June. This species is a regular visitor in varying numbers on the Lleida drylands in May.



This young male Red-footed Falcon spent much of his time pouncing on grasshoppers from a perch in an almond tree.



Displaying male **Little Bustards** were displaying on the drylands of Lleida from around the 20th April to early June. **Large wintering flocks** of Little bustards, consisting of several hundred birds were regularly observed in the area between Lleida and Tàrrega in the November-February period.

Red-rumped Swallows continue the process that is taking them to colonize parts of the southern half of the province of Lleida. Two birds were observed near Ager with an Ornitholidays group in early April, and others have been observed in Montsec at Os de Balaguer and Alòs de Balaguer, and in the vicinity of the River Ebro at Bovera, Ascó, Flix and other locations.

Long-billed Dowitcher. On 14th April, the penultimate day of the Ornitholiday's Catalonia tour participants were fortunate to spot a Long-billed Dowitcher in the Ebro delta. This is a rarity in Spain, and in all likelihood this particular bird had arrived the previous autumn, had been lost from view until rediscovered by us. On the same day the lucky tour participants were also treated to no fewer than **7 Red-throated Pipits**.



Winter tours

April and May are by far the most popular months for a birding trip to northeast Spain, but gradually more and more birders are becoming aware of the advantages of planning a winter trip to the region:

- **High mountain species** like Wallcreeper, Alpine Accentor, Snowfinch and Citril Finch become more accessible
- Plains species like Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Pin-tailed and Black-bellied Sandgrouse form large flocks
- Young Bonelli's and Golden Eagles disperse over large areas, making them easier to observe
- Interesting **resident species** stay around: Lammergeier, Black Vulture, Eagle Owl, Black Wheatear, Black Woodpecker, Dupont's Lark, Black-winged Kite ...
- Large flocks of Cranes gather at Gallocanta
- Enjoy some winter sunshine

So when planning your next long weekend **between November and February**, think about birding in northeast Spain.



Where the birds are in northeast Spain is the ideal travel companion for any birder planning a trip to the region.

Storm Petrel \cdot Pomarine Skua \cdot Arctic Skua \cdot Great Skua \cdot Balearic Shearwater \cdot Mediterranean Shearwater \cdot Cory's Shearwater \cdot Sooty Shearwater \cdot Gannet \cdot Audouin's Gull \cdot Mediterranean Gull \cdot Gull-billed Tern \cdot Sandwich Tern \cdot Common Tern \cdot Little Tern \cdot Black Tern \cdot Whiskered Tern


